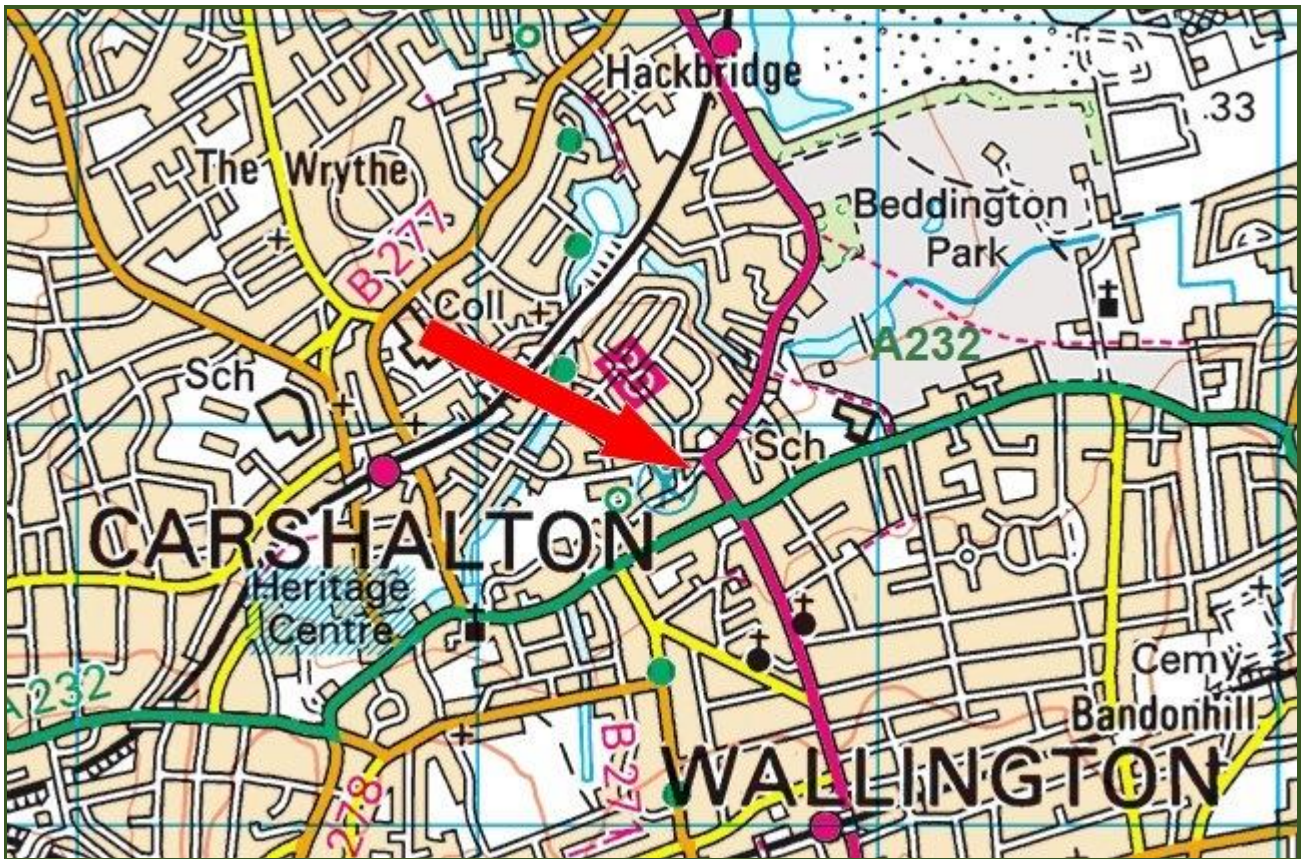

The Walk: A 2.5 mile flat walk on good footpaths around Beddington Park. Suitable for buggies and plenty of seating on the way round.

The Venue: A dog friendly pub with a large pub garden at the rear. Children 14 years old and over. are allowed until 7.00pm. Unfortunately **no children under 14** are allowed. Sunday Roast is available but you must book in advance. To book lunch ring 0208 401 0035. Cars can be left in the car park during the walk.

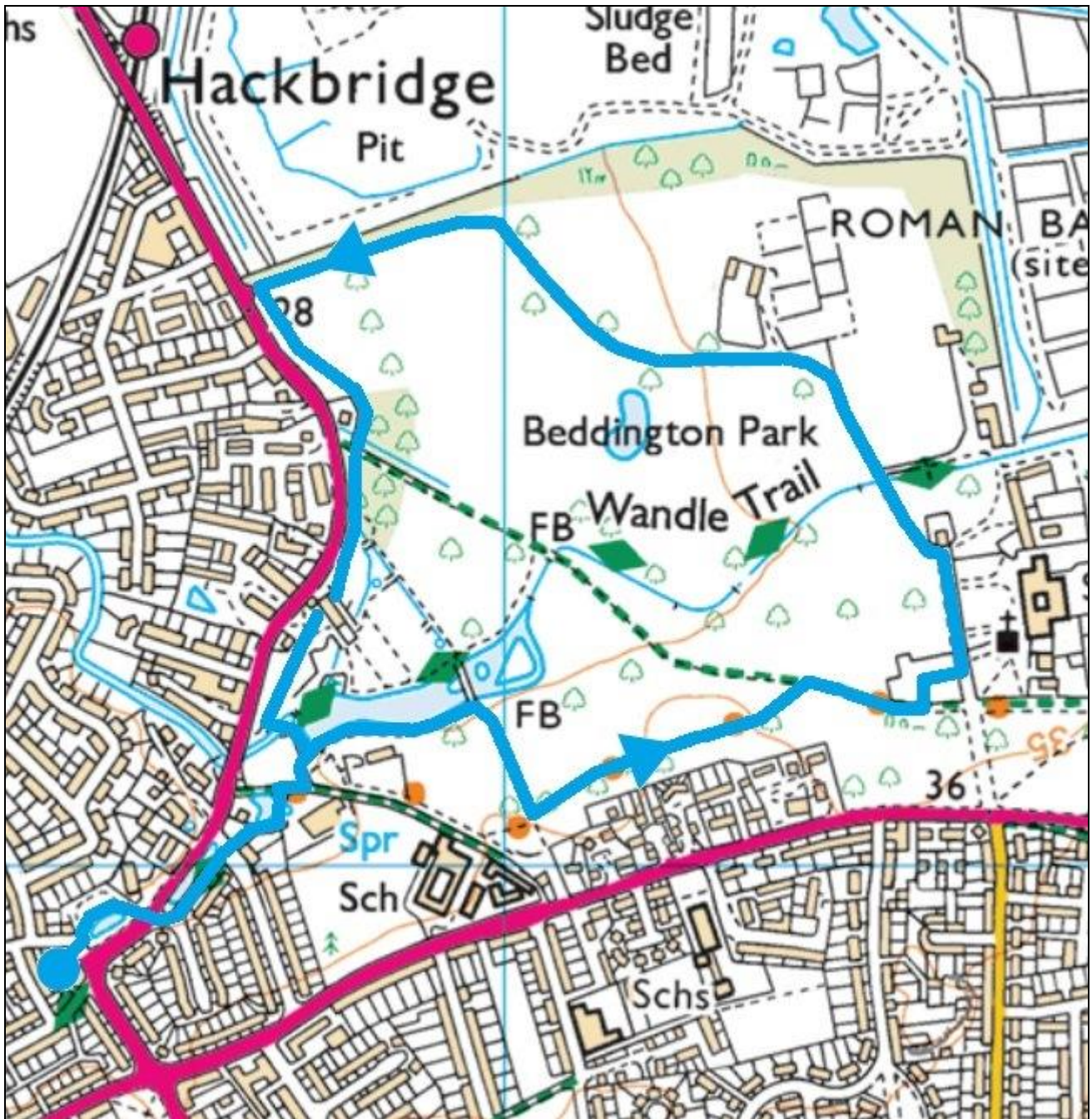


OS Grid Reference: TQ 28522 64886

Directions: Take the A232 to Wallington Green then turn right (left if you are coming from Carshalton direction) down Manor Road North. The pub is straight ahead past Londis and the car park is at the far end of the pub, on the left.

Public Transport: Wallington Station is a 15 minute (0.6 miles) walk. Turn left out of station and down the main road (A237) to Wallington Green. Cross over main road (A232) and straight ahead on Manor Road North. Buses 407, 410, 463 and X25 all stop at Wallington Green.

Starter Clues: From the far end of Londis to the end of the pub building in the car park.

1. He does not sound like the biting sort
2. Confident security
3. Where words once ran wild

Stage One: Cross road outside pub and around top of the pond to the main road. Cross at the bollards, left then right into no through road and left into Lakeside. Keep ahead on the right hand side and cross another road to the entrance to Beddington Park.

4. Please look into where cars halt on this road.
(Spare Clue a: This was a mountain many years ago)
5. One in five is heavy in the end
6. Looks like the Chair is protected by this

Stage 2: Ahead on path into the park. Cross stone bridge and ahead to finger post. Turn right, through the barriers and left at top of the car park. Follow the green railings round the top of the pond and then keep ahead to span bridge at the end. Turn right up wide path which bends to the right, to the large Beddington Park sign on the right.

7. Did someone decide to put their initials up to celebrate winning the World Cup?
8. Definitely a place for beginners
9. These will keep your feet on the ground

Stage 3: Turn left onto cycle path. Go straight ahead and follow path around to the right to a flint stone wall. Follow the wall, turn left at the gap in the wall and through the garden. Turn right on path at the other side and up to the lych gate.

(Spare Clue b: A straight fight)

10. A capital journey
11. Saucy sounding supply
12. A quality set in stone

Stage 4: Turn left out of the gate and along road. Take path to the left of the building in the middle. Cross bridge over the river and keep ahead on path which then goes to the left to the barrier opposite the playground.

13. Somewhere to display our abilities
14. A fragile connection
15. You will be in the soup if you fall in there

Stage 5: Through the barrier and ahead. Follow the path as it goes to the left and ahead to a finger post just before the big gate.

16. It is not all swings and roundabouts
17. A light you can count on.
18. A retro pen container?

Stage 6: Turn left at the finger post and ahead, through the trees, over bridge to a junction. Go ahead on path. At end, ahead over bridge, through the car park and under archway to the front of the Grange.

19. Distant reminders of Sweden
20. Beware of low flying bikes
21. Sounds like the mail has been lost
22. MI5 or MI6?

Stage 7: Down drive in front of the Grange and turn left by the litter bin, before the height barrier ahead. Right over a stone bridge then right over another stone bridge and ahead by the side of the lake to the railings. Turn right, then right at end of car park to the barriers.

23. There must be another way!
24. Beware or you could get a shock
25. Only when sweeping will owners see the latent sadness of this tree

Through the barriers and turn left. Retrace your steps back to the Beddington Park entrance. Cross road, ahead to end then turn right. Cross road and left back to the pub.
